# B. Discussion Only-Review of four possible text amendments:

Minimum Acreage for Condo Developments-Mr. Sika noted that currently there is a ten (10) acre minimum for condominium developments. The thought is to change this so that construction could take place on a single lot if desired. Most communities do allow this and in discussing with the Township Attorney, there is no reason that could be thought of for a ten acre minimum requirement.

Cell Tower Camouflage-to reduce how visible these towers can be. Mr. Sommers did note that in some regards it does draw more attention to the pole and is an ugly solution. He felt there needs to be wording so that in some cases it would not be necessary especially if it does not fit into the existing surroundings. Mr. Sika noted that some additional changes to the cell tower ordinance to consider would be the height requirement, changing the color of the tower poles to make them more of a fit to the surroundings as well.

Future Right-of-Way Easement Requirement-to ensure that new construction is far enough back to allow for future right-of-way.

Regulation of Food Trucks-Mr. Sommers felt it makes a lot of sense to require a permit for them. The idea of not allowing them within so many feet of a permanent business that provides food was thought to be a good one. Charging a fee as well as setting a time requirement was also thought to be ideal.

Further work will be done to provide the Planning Commission with a draft of these text amendments for review and discussion at a future meeting.
