May 3, 2022 Election: Hemlock Public School District Bonding Proposal

There will be a Special Election for voters who live in Thomas Township and vote in Precincts 3 and 4 only, located at the Thomas Township Public Safety Building, 8215 Shields Drive, Saginaw, Michigan 48609. Hemlock Public Schools has put forth a May 3, 2022, bonding proposal that reads as follows:

HEMLOCK PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT BONDING PROPOSAL

Shall Hemlock Public School District, Saginaw and Midland Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Forty One Million Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$41,900,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, in one or more series, for the purpose of: erecting, furnishing and equipping additions to school buildings; remodeling, furnishing and refurnishing and equipping and re-equipping school buildings; acquiring, installing and equipping or reequipping school buildings for instructional technology; purchasing school buses; and preparing, developing, improving and equipping playgrounds, playfields, athletic fields and facilities and sites?

The following is for informational purposes only: The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2024, under current law, is 0.80 mill (\$0.80 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a -o- mill net increase over the previous year's levy. The maximum number of years the bonds of any series may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is thirty (30) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 3.02 mills (\$3.02 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

The school district does not expect to borrow from the State to pay debt service on the bonds. The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$5,740,000. The total amount of qualified loans currently outstanding is \$0. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited and the proceeds cannot be used for repair or maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or employee salaries, or other operating expenses.)

Absentee ballot requests can be submitted online at www.michigan.gov/vote. Applications are also available at the Township Office located at 249 North Miller Road. Once the completed application is received, a ballot will be mailed to the address indicated. The last day to request a mailed ballot is April 29, 2022. After that date, ballots can be requested in person until 4:00 p.m. on May 2, 2022. Two secure drop boxes are available for voted ballots, one is located just outside the Township Office and the other is a mail slot to the right of the main door. Ballots may also be returned by mail. Please allow 7 to 10 days for delivery.

The Michigan Voter Information Center (MVIC) is available online to check voter registration, preview the ballot or track the status of your ballot. Visit the MVIC at www.michigan.gov/vote. The last day to register to vote other than in-person at the local clerk's office is April 18, 2022. The polls will be open at 7 a.m. and will close at 8 p.m., please respect the election workers and the space of others while exercising your right to vote.

Keeping Grass Cut

Now that April is officially here, it's time to think about getting your lawn mower ready to cut for the summer. In Thomas Township, it is the responsibility of the property owner to keep lawns to a height of no more than ten inches (10") beginning May 1st. Exceeding this is a violation of the "Noxious Weed Ordinance". you happen to receive a notification that your property is in violation and do not bring the property into compliance, Thomas Township may enter the property and cut the weed/plant growth. Any expenses incurred to do so will be the responsibility of the property owner and they will be charged accordingly. Upkeep of the property including taking care of regular lawn maintenance helps to keep the appearance of the neighborhood and Township to a higher standard as well as deterring any vermin from finding a habitat to live. Storm Water and Sanitary Sewer Systems

With the changing of seasons, we see thunderstorms and snow melt off, because of this increased precipitation, it's important to distinguish between a Sanitary Sewer System and a Storm Water System.

Storm Water Sewer System

This system collects rainwater and snow melt from many types of areas. Storm sewers are comprised of enclosed pipes, catch basins, swales, open ditches and semi-open culverts which are operated and maintained by numerous agencies. In many cases, dewatering sump pumps, field drains, irrigation runoff and foundation drains are also directly discharged to these systems. Storm sewers discharge waters directly to the environment, without treatment. You can help with protecting our environment and keeping the storm system operating freely by ensuring the drains in your yards are not plugged with debris, and that the drainage culverts under your driveways are clean. Always be mindful to not dump any sort of chemicals, oils, paints, or antifreeze into any sewer, especially a storm sewer.

With few exceptions, the Saginaw County Road Commission is responsible for the operations and maintenance of the storm water system. If you have a storm sewer problem and require assistance, please call the Road Commission at 989-752-6140. Sanitary Sewer System

Sanitary sewers are designed to convey what we normally generate as wastes through the use of toilets, housekeeping and bathing activities. These types of wastes pose specific dangers to the environment and public health if they are improperly handled or discharged without being adequately treated. Thomas Township is responsible for the operation and maintenance of this sewer system. If you have a sanitary sewer backup, call the Township offices at 989-781-0150. Saginaw Area Drinking Water Consumer Confidence Report

A Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), also know as the annual water quality report provides information on your local drinking water quality. Every community water supplier must provide an annual report by July 1 of each year to its customers on the quality of the drinking water and the sources of that water, and to characterize the risks (if any) from exposure to contaminants detected in the water. according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Consumer Confidence Report Rule.

Thomas Township partners with the City of Saginaw to complete this report. When all the data has been compiled, it will be hosted on the City of Saginaw website. Your notification will be on your water bill, and direct you via webpage to view the Saginaw Area Consumer Confidence Report. Outdoor Water Restrictions

Beginning June 1st, 2022 the annual outdoor water restrictions will be taking effect. The outdoor water restriction will continue until September 1st, 2022. During the restrictions using outdoor water for washing the car, watering the garden or grass and other summer activities will be limited according to your address.

Even number addresses may use outdoor water on even days and odd number addresses may use water on odd days. By putting these restrictions in place, we can control excessive demands for water, which helps keep our water rates lower. Thank you in advance for helping us conserve water.

Before & After Camp Care

Before and After camp care is for parents who need to drop off or pick up their children before or after the scheduled camp time. A counselor will stay with any children if they need to be dropped off early or stay late. Before and After Camp Care begins at 7:30 am and ends at 5:30 pm.

All children must be registered and paid in advance for this service.

ONLINE REGISTRATION is available for Parks and Recreation Programming. You can access the online registration at thomastwp.org. When using the online registration system to register for Parks and Recreation Programing, you MUST pay for the program you are registering for at the time you fill out the registration form or you will not be considered enrolled in that program. Registration is a two step process. Once you hit *REGISTER NOW*, you will register, agree to the terms and hit *SEND*. You will then be redirected to the payment options on the next screen. From there you should receive a confirmation email of payment. If you do not receive a confirmation, then your payment was not able to be processed and registration will not be able to be completed.
