• **EXPLANATION OF TOPIC:** You received a copy of the final draft of the 2019/20 Fiscal Year Budget last with a cover memo listing the final changes that were made to the draft copy. I am including the list as follows:

General Fund Revenues

- Added \$372,000 in projected revenues for the grant to purchase the Heritage Insurance building.
- Removed the \$300,000 for the potential grant match, because grant will not be available until 2020/21 fiscal year.

o Treasurer-Finance

• Removed paper folder from office equipment in budget twice.

Municipal Building

- Removed paper folder under capital outlay.
- Reduced the parking lot addition from \$135,000 to \$100,000.

Parks Facility Acquisition/Construction

- Removed the mill & pave of parking lot at diamond 1.
- Added Marquee Sign at Roberts Park.
- Removed garage addition.
- Removed \$603,000 for Nature Preserve Renovations, because grant will not be available until the 2020/21 fiscal year.

o Transfers-in

• Reduced transfer-in for Police Fund to amount agreed on by the Board at the 2018/2019 budget workshop.

Health Insurance

• All Health Insurance line items were reduced to reflect the new rates as there is no increase for the coming year.

o General Fund - fund balance

Added fund balance reserve for building improvements of \$250,000 this year – total of \$500,000.

Public Safety Police

- Reduced transfer-in to amount agreed on by board at 2018/2019 budget workshop.
- Transferred sale of fixed assets to correct year.
- Adjusted both the salaried wage line item and the hourly wage line item.
- Salaried from \$155,620 to \$171,825.
- Full-time hourly from \$383,046 to \$323,077.
- Also adjusted correlating wage related items such as FICA and pension.

With the exception of the DDA Fund, all Funds are in a solid position. Revenues are down, but that is in part representative of when grants are being received. Likewise, overall General Fund expenditures are down as well resulting from the timing of which year grants are received.

All of the staff did an excellent job of putting together their respective budgets. As always, we have looked at the numbers through a relatively conservative eyeglass. We are not proposing taking on any debt in this year's budget. All capital improvement and regular expenditures are covered by savings or incoming revenues.

The Park Commission has approved those portions of the budget related to the Parks and Recreation operations. The DDA Board will be holding a meeting later in March at which time they will consider approval of their budget. The Township Board's approval will have to include a contingency for the DDA Board's approval as a result.

A resolution to establish a general appropriations act for Thomas Township; to define the power and duties of the Thomas Township officers in relation to the administration of the budget; and to provide remedies for refusal or neglect to comply with the requirements of this ordinance.
The Board of Trustees of Thomas Township resolves:
Section 1: Title
This resolution shall be known as the Thomas Township General Appropriations Act.
Section 2: Chief Administrative Officer
The Manager shall be the Chief Administrative Officer and shall perform the duties of the Chie Administrative Officer enumerated in the resolution.
Section 3: Fiscal Officer
The Fiscal Services Director shall be the Fiscal Officer and shall perform the duties of the Fiscal Officer enumerated in this act.

Section 4: Public Hearings on the Budget

Pursuant to MCLA 141.412; MCLA 141.413, notice of a public hearing on the proposed budget was published in a newspaper of general circulation on February 21, 2019 and a public hearing on the proposed budget was held on March 4, 2019.

Section 6: Millage Levy

The Thomas Township Board shall cause to be levied and collected the general property tax on all real and personal property within the township upon the current tax roll an amount equal to 3.1937 mills as authorized under state law and approved by the electorate. The mills to be levied are:

These millage rates are subject to reduction based upon current year millage reduction (Headlee) requirements.

Section 7: Adoption of Budget by Reference

The budgets in Thomas Township for the general fund, public safety-fire department operating fund, fire apparatus fund, public safety-police department operating fund, revolving road fund, parks and recreation fund, sewer fund, water fund, and municipal refuse fund are hereby adopted by reference, with revenues and activity expenditures as indicated in Section 5 of this act.

Section 8: Adoption of Budget by Cost Center

The Board of Trustees of Thomas Township adopts the 2019/2020 fiscal year general fund, water fund, sanitary sewer fund and parks and recreation fund budgets by cost center. Township appointed staff responsible for the expenditures authorized in the budget may expend township funds up to, but not to exceed, the total appropriation authorized for each cost center in these funds and may make transfers among the various line items contained in the cost center appropriation. Those responsible for the fire department operating, fire department apparatus, police department operating, and municipal refuse fund may expend funds up to, but not to exceed the total appropriation authorized for each fund and may make transfers among the various line items within the fund appropriation. However, no transfers of appropriations for line items related to personnel or capital expenditures may be made without prior board approval by budget amendment.

Section 9: Michigan Public Act 152 of 2011

The Michigan Public Act 152 of 2011 Limits the amount a public employer may contribute to a medical benefit plan, but allows its governing body, by a 2/3 vote, to exempt the governmental unit from the requirements of the Act for each fiscal year; therefore be it resolved that Thomas Township, pursuant to Sec. 8 (1) of PA 152 of 2011 (MCL 15.568) exempts itself from the requirements of the Act for its 2013-14 fiscal year.

Section 10: Appropriation not a Mandate to Spend

Appropriations will be deemed maximum authorizations to incur expenditures. The fiscal officer shall exercise supervision and control to ensure that expenditures are within appropriations and shall not issue any order for expenditures that exceed appropriations.

Section 11: Transfer Authority

The Chief Administrative Officer shall have no authority to make transfers among the various cost centers. The Chief Administrative Officer shall make recommendations to the board for amendments to this resolution to approve transfers among the various cost centers within a fund. Under no circumstances may the total budget of any fund be changed without board approval.

Section 12: Periodic Fiscal Reports

The fiscal officer shall transmit to the board at the end of each month a report of financial operations, including but not limited to:

- a. a cash balances report showing the amount of funds available in each of the various accounts
- b. a revenue and expenditure report which shows for each line item and cost center in the various funds the original budget, the amended budget, the year to date actual amounts, the current month actual amount, any encumbered amounts, the unencumbered balance and the percent of budget revenue received or expenditures made.

Section 13: Limit on Obligations and Payments

No obligation shall be incurred against, and no payment shall be made from any appropriation account unless there is a sufficient unencumbered balance in the appropriation and sufficient funds are or will be available to meet the obligation.

Section 14: Budget Monitoring

Whenever it appears to the Chief Administrative Officer or the Township Board that the actual and probable revenues in any fund will be less than the estimated revenues upon which appropriations from such fund were based, and when it appears that expenditures shall exceed an appropriation, the

Chief Administrative Officer shall present to the township board recommendations to prevent expenditures from exceeding available revenues or appropriations for the current fiscal year. Such recommendations shall include proposals for reducing appropriations, increasing revenues, or both.

Section 15: Violations of This Act

Any obligation incurred or payment authorized in violation of this resolution shall be void and shall subject any responsible official(s) or employee(s) to disciplinary action as outline in P.A. 621 (1978) and the Thomas Township Personnel Manual.

Approve the budget amendments to the 2018/19 fiscal year

EXPLANATION OF TOPIC: Once again we have had a productive year and as we near the end of the 2018/19 fiscal year the budgets are in need of some miscellaneous amendments. The attached amended budget helps to easily identify the variations from the original budget. We did not list each variation however below are some of the more substantial projects and reasons for the amendments.

General Fund requires transfer between activity centers in Legislative, Elections, Train, Soccer and Archery. Treasurer/Finance, Assessing, Building & Grounds, Community Development and Construction Codes have minor adjustments to wages and wage related items. The transfer into Legislative is related to increased legal fees and the change in the employer contribution to pension. With the purchase of two additional tabulators for the AV counting board the elections activity requires a transfer in. The transfer into the train activity center is due to the purchase of the additional train. Both the Soccer and Archery transfers are the result of increased program participation. The transfers do not have a negative effect on fund balance.

The Public Safety Fire Fund includes transfers into wages full-time hourly along with an increase in the capital improvements line item. With the transition from part-time to full-time clerical and the promotion of the Sargent to the Assistant Chief the Public Safety Police requires transfers between wages and wage related items. The transfers do not have a negative effect on fund balance.

The Sewer and Water Funds both require minor transfers in wages and wage related items. Due to an increase in demand for water from Hemlock Semi-Conductor the purchasing water line item has been increased by \$54,597. This increase also results in a higher than expected water usage revenue of \$145,000 over the amount originally budgeted. The transfer will not have a negative effect on fund equity.

Manufactured homes including mobile and modular home building permit fees shall be reduced by 50% when located within a designated mobile/modular home park.

Commercial or Industrial Construction:

The Township Building Inspector may use the construction cost given by the developer or at his/her option, the Building Inspector may determine construction cost by using the cost per square foot found in the building valuation data chart provided in Building Standards Publication, August 2010 edition. The developer must include all site development costs when providing construction cost for permit purposes.

Thomas Township shall determine permit fees for construction as follows:

Plan review fees will be invoiced and payable when the respective permit for which the review was conducted is obtained. At the Building, Electrical, Plumbing, or Mechanical Inspectors request, an expert outside plan review may be requested, the total cost of which including an additional 5% Township administration charge will be paid by the developer prior to obtaining the respective permit, or immediately after said plan review is completed.

The Building, Electrical, Plumbing, or Mechanical Inspector may request a specialized expert outside plan review during construction to address issues such as changes in plan design or other unforeseen reasons. The total cost of which including an additional a 5% Township administration charge will be paid by the developer immediately after said expert plan review is completed and findings presented to the Building Inspector. The developer shall pay any and all costs associated with said expert outside plan review within 30 days of notification.

Thomas Township Special Manufacturing Building Inspector Cost Recovery Fee:

For exceptional situations where the Director of Community Development determines that a special manufacturing inspector is necessary, arrangements shall be made to contract an inspector with the necessary qualifications to fill the position. All costs for said inspector shall be directly billed as an additional separate inspection fee.

EXPLANATION OF TOPIC: The majority of our excavation work is for repairing or replacing water service curb boxes and digging graves. While we can almost always accomplish both of these tasks with our current skid-steer based backhoe equipment, we have serious limitations with the use of this particular piece of equipment. In the cemetery, our skid-steer is usually larger than the area that is required for an excavation and we need to physically move numerous head stones in order to maneuver around or dig in a particular area. This subjects headstones, markers and the adjoining gravesites to potential damages. When digging up a water service curb box for repair, this unit does an unreasonable amount of damage to the lawn and landscaping. In all cases, the additional damages are because the skid-steer is a wheel-based piece of equipment that maneuvers by pivoting on its tires rather than just articulating the backhoe attachment.

As we progress into the future, we have a departmental goal to install some of the new water service connections ourselves and saving some of the costs that are currently associated with contracted connections. The current skid-steer based backhoe machine has a maximum digging depth of around 7 feet and does not have the reach necessary to do this work. As the new Lead & Copper rules come into effect, the State will require "field verification" of service line materials. This work can only be completed by inspecting the water service line on the property side of the right-of-way. There are multiple ways for us to determine this, but one such way is by excavating if necessary. We routinely repair water service curb-box valves to repair shut off valves as well as verify water service composition. But our current skid-steer based equipment causes a lot of damages to surrounding property as it maneuvers around to excavate and its size limits our capabilities to work in restrictive areas.

To continue with this type of work, we need to seriously look at alternative equipment that can do the same type of work while afflicting less damage to the surrounding area and that has a smaller operational footprint that allows us to safely work in restrictive areas. We can be much more efficient when digging graves, replacing curb boxes and verifying service line material with a compact excavator.

A compact excavator is situated atop rubber tracks and the whole unit articulates 360 degrees without constantly rotating its tires to turn. Because of this type of operation, an excavator does not damage the area outside of the immediate area near as much as a skid-steer. The compact excavator is narrower and much more maneuverable than our current equipment and would allow us to excavate and maneuver in a smaller footprint making it less likely for us to move or damage other monuments, headstones or other sites in the cemetery. Finally, the current skid-steer based backhoe has a maximum digging depth of 7 feet. The excavator will have a digging depth of at least 11.2 feet and this additional digging depth would allow us to reach most of our water mains.

The operational cost savings related to replacing our skid-steer based backhoe with a compact excavator is considerable, mainly by saving on the time and materials necessary to restore an area afterward but also with the labor time saved per excavation. For example, the current labor cost for a 3-hour curb box repair is currently estimated at \$268.11. Logically, if we cut that labor time in half, (because there is less restoration work needed afterward), the project cost also is cut roughly in half. Considering that we complete 50 excavations over the course of a year, we would save about \$6,700 in labor costs just related to time savings. Currently we pay Messing Excavating around \$1,000 every time he makes a connection and that price will most likely double when he retires later this year. If we were able to complete even one third of the possible 20 water service connections typically completed each year, we would realize a savings to the Township of between \$6,000 and \$10,000 in the first year alone.

Because of the reasons outlined, Public Works sought bids for a new compact excavator that would be used as the primary digging equipment for the department while doing these types of tasks. A sealed bid, competitive process was followed and we requested and received quotes from 4 vendors. Carleton Equipment, AIS, Tri-County Equipment, and Michigan Cat all submitted bids. After reviewing the bids to ensure all of the required specifications were met, we are recommending purchasing a compact excavator from Carleton Equipment in the amount of \$46,945.00. This purchase price for the new excavator includes all assembly costs and delivery of the equipment and is \$3,117.00 under the budgeted amount.

This was a budgeted expense in the 2018/19 Water and Sewer Capital Outlay budget as \$25,031 was allocated from each fund (for a total of \$50,062).
