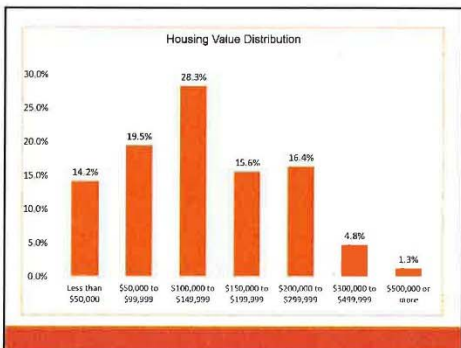
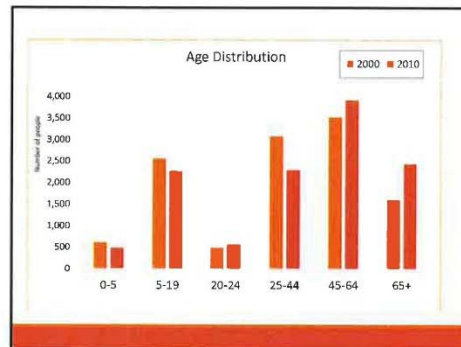
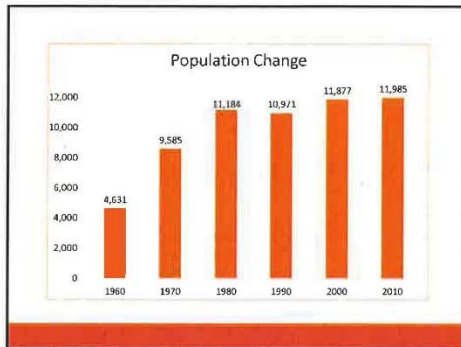


Process

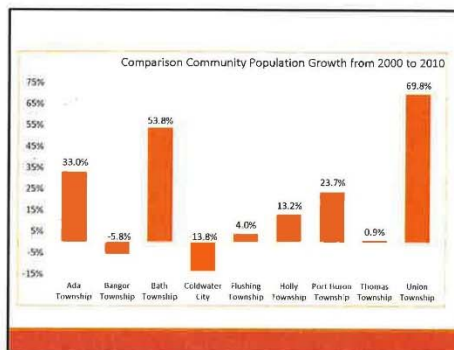

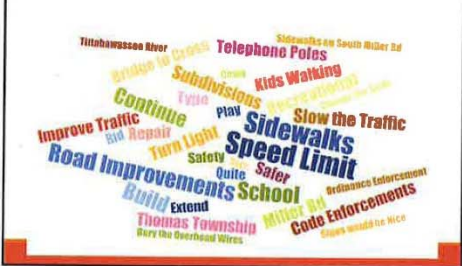









What is one thing you would do to improve Thomas Township? 158 responses



Goals

- 12 overall goals
 - Three examples of objectives included with the goals:
 1. Maintain the “rural character” of Thomas Township through innovative mechanisms designed to conserve open space, protect the natural environment and preserve agricultural lands.
 2. Preserve and enhance the water quality of and recreation opportunities on the Tittabawassee River
 3. Continue to work toward development of an M-46 parallel road north of M-46.

Next Steps

1. Planning Commission recommends sending draft to Township Board
2. Township Board approves draft for distribution
3. 42-day review period (plan is sent to neighboring jurisdictions, the county and registered entities)
4. Planning Commission holds public hearing after the 42-day review period
5. Planning Commission approves master plan via resolution
6. Township Board may affirm Planning Commission's decision (optional)

Eggers reviewed the information in each slide noting that Thomas Township has had an increase in population, comes in higher than the County and the state in Median Income and compares quite well to the similar communities used for the benchmarking.

He discussed the results of the Community Survey that was taken and felt that a good response was received in comparison to how these results normally come back to a community. Weise questioned that with it only being 2% of the population that responded was that not a low number? Eggers stated that in seeing how results are achieved in other community surveys he felt that Thomas Township was successful in its results. He noted that the more results that come in, the more the numbers seem to level off and you don't get what he felt is an accurate representation.

Eggers noted that based on the community survey results, the residents live here because they like the community, and in five years 43% still see themselves living here. He mentioned that based on the results most residents utilize the Thomas Township website as their main way of receiving information about the Township. He furthered his presentation of the results stating that results show people in the community feel more restaurants are needed, they are impressed with the improvements of the M-46 corridor, and people want to see more trails constructed like the Thomas Township Trail.

Eggers reviewed the next steps in the Master Plan Update process including recommendation by the Planning Commission to send the draft to the Board, the review period thereafter and the Public Hearing and resolution if accepted. Weise questioned the current schedule of the update and Eggers noted the survey did stay available for more than the month originally planned and that there were delays due to a cancelled Planning Commission meeting and a heavy agenda for another. All in all he said it is on track and at the finish.

Radewahn remarked that it was good news to hear people are impressed with the M-46 corridor improvements that have been made.

A motion was made by McDonald and seconded by Lamountain to recommend sending the Master Plan Draft to the Thomas Township Board. The motion passed unanimously.

8. Motion was made by Radewahn, supported by Weber to adjourn the special board meeting at 8:45 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
