### Roberts Park Soccer Pavilion Ready to Go for 2016

Thomas Township Parks and Recreation is very proud to present our new soccer pavilion located at Roberts Park.

When I arrived in Thomas Township in 2009, one of the first projects that I was told about was the Roberts Park Expansion. In 2008, Hemlock Semiconductor kicked off the project with a generous \$200,000 donation to build the soccer fields. Now, just 8 years later, we are close to wrapping up the second phase. With three full size soccer fields, three pavilions, four softball fields, walking trails, pond and play areas, Roberts Park is truly a jewel in the heart of Thomas Township.

As you may have seen, the newest addition to Roberts Park is the soccer pavilion located at the center of the soccer fields and parking area. This 3,100 square foot building houses heated men's and woman's

bathrooms, a concession stand, and a garage. The back of the building is a covered pavilion complete with a sound system, outlets and water fountains. During events and soccer games, the concession stand will serve hot dogs, brats, nachos, pickles, Gatorade, pop, coffee and chips.

The pavilion was built entirely through donations. The Dow Corning Foundation, on behalf of Hemlock Semiconductor, donated \$200,000 to get the fund raising started in March of 2015. With this generous donation we were able to move forward seeking the additional money needed to complete the project. The list on page 8 includes the companies, foundations and individuals who helped make this much needed building possible.

#### **ONLINE REGISTRATION:**



# Fire Department News

### **OUTDOOR SIREN TESTING**

On April 13, The State of Michigan including Saginaw County, will be conducting a tornado warning siren test at 1:30pm. This test will last 3-5 minutes with a steady siren blast. The intent of an outdoor weather siren is to notify you of a tornado warning when you are outside of your home or business. For notifications inside your home or business, you may want to sign up for the Saginaw County Notifications system under <a href="https://www.saginawcounty911.com">www.saginawcounty911.com</a>. At this web site, you can sign up for tornado warnings, public safety or public utility information affecting your address.

Remember a Tornado WATCH – means conditions are favorable for a tornado to develop and you should keep an "eye to the sky" and remain vigilant. A Tornado WARNING – mean s a Tornado has been spotted within our County and you should seek shelter immediately.

Beginning in May and ending in September, the monthly siren testing will take place at 6:00pm instead of at noon. This allows the night dispatchers to become familiar with this system versus just the day dispatchers. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact our office.

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### **DPW NEWS**



### Department of Public Works 2016 Spring Newsletter

Beginning in March, DPW staff began its yearly maintenance work on both the water and sewer systems. For our water system, we are completing preventive maintenance on all of our fire hydrants. This program includes flushing the water mains and testing the operation of each individual fire hydrant. This work is done to make sure that our hydrants operate properly in emergencies and to remove air. "old water" or mineral buildups that may have become trapped within the water mains. Overall, these activities ensure that the water delivered to your home or business is of the highest quality available. During the overall maintenance work, we will also be lubricating, painting and ensuring that fire hydrants are unobscured. In some areas, we will measure water pressure and flow rates of a particular water main while flushing a hydrant. The work will be completed in phases throughout the spring, summer and fall, ending in October.

Work on our sanitary sewers will begin in mid to late April as we clean major portions of the sewer pipelines of grease and built up materials. Cleaning will consist of high pressure spray. This is necessary to ensure that the sewers continue to flow unobstructed. Work is expected to continue through the summer.

All of the maintenance work will take place within the road right-of-way. Please be mindfull of the workers and equipment in the area and always remember to "Give Em a Brake".

### Construction News....

Later this summer or fall, we are planning on replacing a sewage pumping station located on Thunderbird. The new project will replace the pumps and controls, along with a permanent emergency electric generator.

### Storm Water Control Update....

Trees are both beautiful and functional. They shade vour house from the scorching sun in the summer and block it from icy winds in the winter. Trees improve air quality by catching dust in the air and provide a valuable habitat for birds and other wildlife. Did you know that a mature tree canopy can also intercept 1,600 gallons of rainwater per year? This is storm water that may otherwise run off of roofs and streets, causing pollution to local water bodies. When selecting trees for your yard, it is best to plant a variety of native species to prevent the spread of disease. By interspersing conifers and deciduous trees, you will ensure that your landscape is using water throughout the year. You can find trees at your local nursery or take part in an Arbor Day tree sale through your city or local Soil and Water Conservation District.

You know spring has sprung....Curbside Yard Waste Pickup resumes the first Friday in April!!!

### **FIRE HYDRANTS**

If you have a hydrant located in your yard, please make sure that plants and shrubs are at least 6 feet away from the centerline of the hydrant. This clear area is necessary so that the hydrant can be quickly located, hooked to and operated in emergency conditions. Thank you for your help.

### **Outdoor Water Restrictions**

Annual Outdoor Water Use Restrictions will resume June 1 and continue until August 31. Even addresses may use outdoor water on even dates, and odd number addresses on odd dates. Thomas Township greatly appreciates your cooperation as we conserve our water resources.

keeping our parks in good or-

der convinced the Board that some additional help was needed. However, they wanted to keep the cost to a minimum, so the creation of a part-time position seemed to be the best solution.

Will actually started his work career in the Township Parks Department before acquiring his education and experience in the assessing field. His familiarity with the parks, the recreation programs and the maintenance work made it an easy fit to expand his duties. With only one full-time position in the Parks Department, having Will join the staff has provided a second person to be available on a permanent basis and will allow the Director more flexibility to address the overall needs of the Department in the future.

He has already become a key contributor to the Department as exemplified this past winter when he obtained a very generous donation from Duro-Last Roofing Company to install a liner on one of our ice skating rinks. This allowed the water to pond without draining away and thereby creating a better surface for skaters. He also brings grant writing skills to this new position that should help with getting more funding support.
