In the past, these fire fighters would have been known as "volunteer fire fighters". By a larger sense, they still "volunteer" their time.

As we all know, there is NEVER enough time in the day, and unfortunately, the fire department is no different, we have men and women who all work full time jobs and still serve this fire department to help those in need. You may be a community minded individual who is willing to sacrifice a bit of your home life for others who are

having a really bad day.

Our Fire Department operates out of two fire stations. It takes a lot of dedicated people to operate an emergency response team around the clock. So, what does it take to run a fire department? 

DAY CAMPS

ONLINE REGISTRATION:







2017 TRAILBLAZER FAMILY FUN RIDE ROUTES







New EXPLORE BOWFISHING Class at Roberts Park



Thomas Township Parks and Recreation will be holding bow fishing classes at Roberts Park this year. The classes will be taught by certified archery instructors who will use a curriculum guide created by the Archery Trade Association. Students will **NOT** be shooting actual fish but targets designed to be placed under the water to emulate a fish. The instructors will be placing signs in the park stating that a class is taking place and people are not trying to kill the fish in the pond. Trailblazer Family Fun Bike Ride

In 2013 the 2.3 mile Thomas Township Trail opened. The trail extends from the parking lot and pavilion at the west side of the Public Safety Building on Shields Drive, near Meijer, and extends south, where it connects with the Saginaw County Parks Saginaw Valley Rail Trail (SVRT).

"The use of our trail has greatly exceeded our expectations. We are seeing many walkers and bicyclists on the trail," Township Parks Director John Corriveau said. "Our citizens said they want more trails and we are planning on extending our trail North, following the power line right-of-way to Miller Road." Last fall a 300 yard connector trail from Roberts Park to O'Hern was built. This will make an easy connection to the Thomas Trail. This project connected the Roberts Park trail system with the rest of the trail system.

More and more people are taking advantage of the trail systems. They can enjoy nature, get some exercise and experience quality family time.

Thomas Township will be inaugurating the Family Fun Ride on Saturday, May 13, 2017, which is Mothers Day weekend.

"It will be a wonderful time for families to get out and enjoy our parks and trail systems," Corriveau said. The event coincides with the Gypsy Culture Flea Market at Roberts Park, a first time for the popular event to be held in Thomas Township.

The bike ride is a fun ride for all members of the family, no matter what your bicycle riding capabilities are. The ride will start from the Bacon Road entrance (off Gratiot) of Roberts Park between 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM and follow the new trail to O'Hern. After a short jaunt down O'Hern the ride connects to the Thomas Trail and then to the SVRT. It is about a three mile ride from Roberts Park to the Saginaw Valley Rail Trail VanWormer Road Trailhead where light refreshments will be available. There are also restrooms.

If you feel the six-mile round trip is a little more than you bargained for, you can turn around at any time.

For those with a little more adventure, it is about seven more miles to St. Charles and the southern terminus of the SVRT which makes it about a 20-mile round trip. There will be refreshments and restrooms in St. Charles.

Those who are more adventurous can ride through Chesaning and on to Oakley on paved rural county roads. This is about a 48-mile round trip. Refreshments and restrooms are available in Chesaning. Riders are encouraged to start this longer ride at 8:00 AM.



There are plans to have a bicycle mechanic or two on hand to help with minor mechanical difficulties. For safety, riders are encouraged to wear helmets and no ear buds. Field Neuroscience plans to have a display on bicycle safety and helmets for sale at a very modest price.



Do you have a controlling individual in your home? Do you need to talk to someone about this? Call 2-1-1 and the professionals will provide you with a non traceable phone number of a professional with whom you can speak about your situation.

This service is an expansion of Midland County's First Call For Help, and Isabella County's Listening Ear. This service is free, and the number is easy to remember, and it has the ability to connect people in need with people who can help, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. And, their website has a live chat available Monday thru Friday from 9am to 5pm. These three simple numbers could make a big difference in your life!

DPW NEWS



Water and Sewer System Maintenance

Beginning in late April, the DPW staff will begin its yearly maintenance work on both the water and sewer systems. For our water system, we will be completing preventive maintenance on all of our fire hydrants. This work will include flushing the water mains and testing the operation of each individual fire hydrant. We do this work to make sure that our hydrants will operate properly in emergencies and to remove air, "old water" or mineral buildups that may have become trapped within the water mains. Overall, these activities will ensure that the water we deliver to your home or business is of the highest quality available. During the overall maintenance work, we will also be lubricating. painting and color coding fire hydrants, while also making sure that the hydrants are un-obscured and un-obstructed. The work will be completed in phases ending in October. You can help us too. If you have a hydrant located in your yard, please make sure that plants and shrubs are at least six feet away from the centerline of the hydrant. This clear area is necessary so that the hydrant can be quickly located, hooked to and operated in an emergency, when every second counts. Thank you for your help.

Work on our sanitary sewers will begin in mid to late April as we clean major portions of the sewer pipelines of grease and "other" built up materials. Cleaning will consist of using high pressure spraying and is necessary to ensure that the sewers continue to flow unobstructed. This work is also expected to be completed by October.

Construction News....

We will be updating the a couple of our more critical sewage pumping stations this year as we standardize our system. All of the maintenance work will take place within the road right-of-way. Please be mind-full of the workers and equipment in the area and always remember to "Give Em a Brake"
